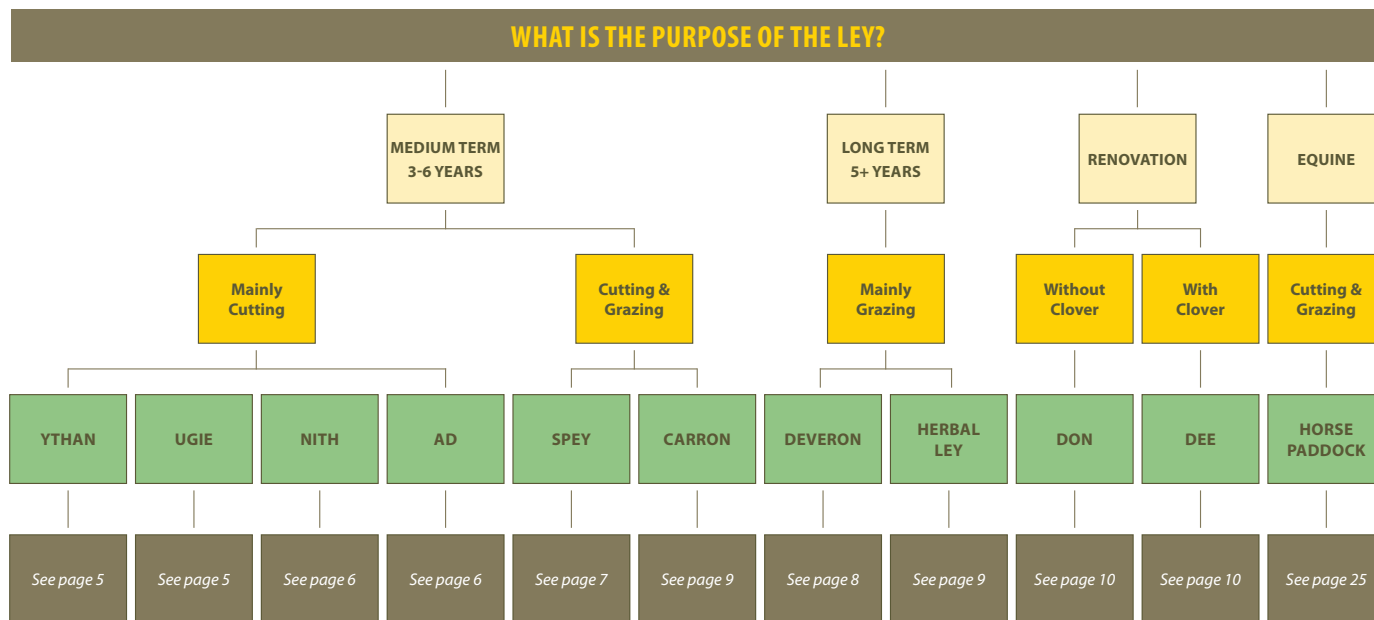

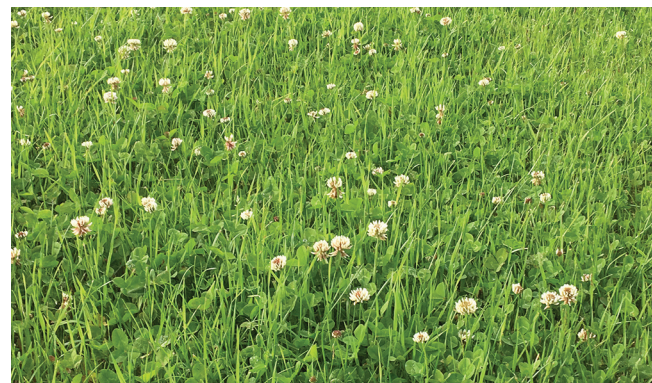

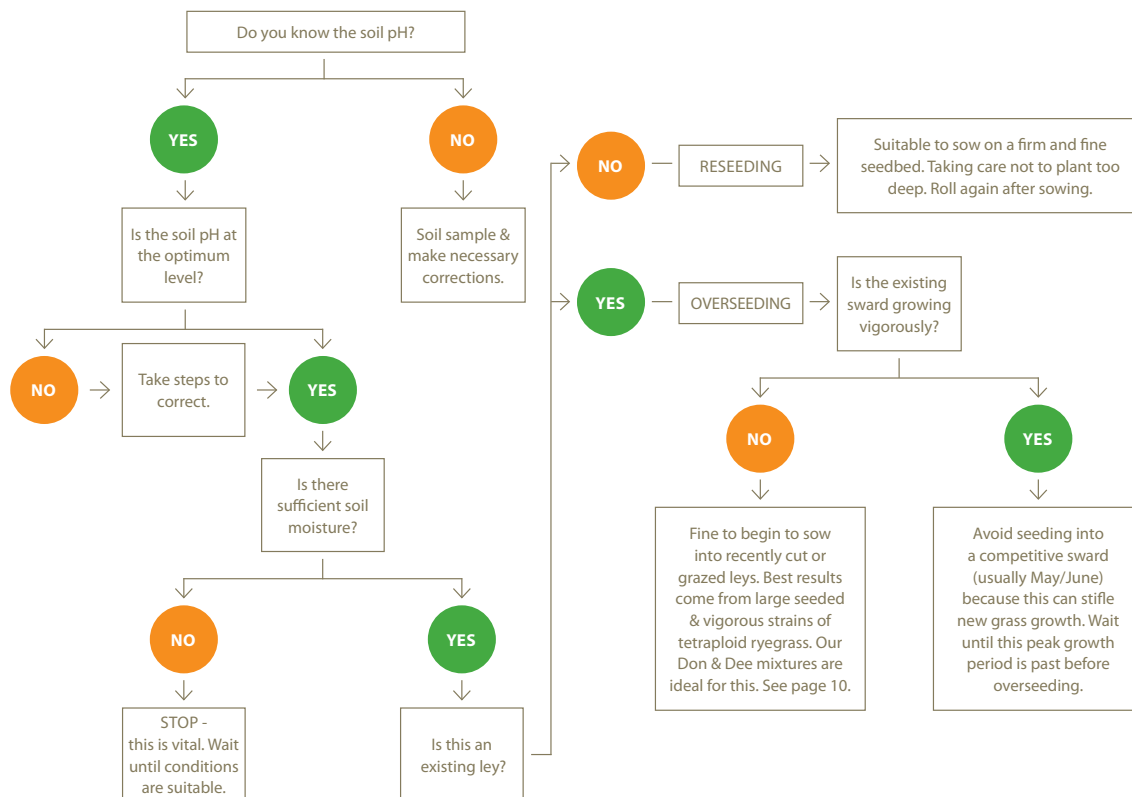

RESEED OR OVERSEED?

Obviously, there is a place for both reseeding and overseeding. However, overseeding is definitely something to consider. It's a great way of improving existing grass leys which may have seen better days for a variety of reasons. It allows the existing grass to be kept and improved whilst minimising cost, time and risk.

It's important when overseeding to resume grazing gently around 4-5 weeks after sowing. Just be careful they don't graze too close, to avoid damaging new seedlings.

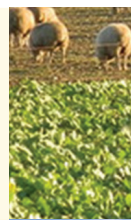

Excellent high energy winter feed with DM yields of around 10 tonnes/ha. Swedes are a very winter hardy feed and are ideal for feeding to cattle or finishing lambs. Swedes are usually strip grazed in the field or harvested for use later on.

KALE

Kale is a well proven forage crop which consistently produces very high yields. The crop has high protein content and can be fed to all types of livestock. Average DM yields of Kale are around 8 – 10 tonnes/ha. Kale can be fed to livestock by strip grazing in the field or zero grazing. Kale is also well suited for full season game cover.

Bombardier	High yielding, clubroot tolerant, tall variety.

Forage rye is becoming more popular for those looking for winter grazing for sheep, a very early bite in spring, followed by a cut of high yielding quality silage. It is well suited to later drilling in light or sandy soils on south facing fields. It gives an excellent mid-season entry for brassicas and allows growers the advantage of having two forage crops in the same field for the year. Italian Ryegrass can also be mixed though which prolongs the spring grazing program.
