**COP 2018/02932 ARTICLE 53 - EMERGENCY AUTHORISATION FOR THE USE OF 'EXIREL 10SE' AS AN INSECTICIDE ON OUTDOOR CHERRY.**

Thank you for your application dated 30<sup>th</sup> November 2018 for an emergency 120 day Authorisation for the use of 'Exirel 10SE' on outdoor cherry. Ministers have agreed to grant an Emergency Authorisation under Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009.

Product name: Exirel 10SE (contains cyantraniliprole)

This emergency authorisation has been given the following expiry dates:

- 25 September 2019 for sale and distribution of stocks
- 30 September 2019 for use
- 31 October 2019 for storage and disposal

Assessment to Uniform Principles

This authorisation is not in accordance with the Uniform Principles but in accordance with national rules.

Amendments to application

It has been brought to my attention that:

- In previous emergency authorisations, no situation accompanied cherry on the Notice of Authorisation. In discussions with the residues team, authorisation can only be recommended for outdoor use. Therefore, this Notice of Authorisation specifically refers to use on outdoor cherry.
- The content of maximum individual dose was not aligned with the other specific restriction regarding the maximum in use concentration (7.5 g active substance / hectalitre). Therefore, this error has been corrected in this Notice of Authorisation.

## Label amendments

The authorisation holder must only sell and supply the product with the agreed label, which is the label agreed on with Headland Agrochemicals Ltd. (HSE ref.: W0019007209), as specified with the labelling requirements according to the Regulation on Classification, Labelling and Packaging of Substances and Mixtures (EC) No. 1272/2008.

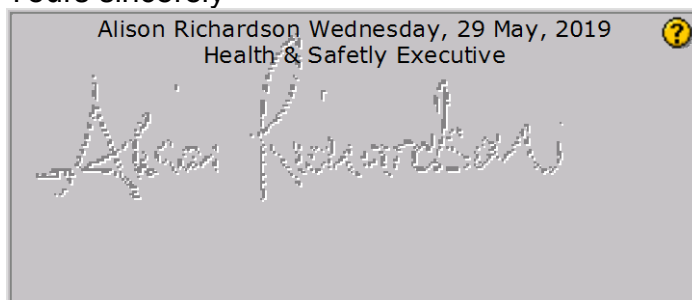
## Conditions of emergency authorisation

The Emergency Authorisation will expire on 30 September 2019 for use and will not be renewed unless the following information is submitted:

- A realistic and detailed spray programme for each crop and indicate where the requested product(s) fit within that programme. This could be based on the spray programmes used in the 2015 to 2019 seasons.
- Details of the area of crop which is outdoor and under protection for the separate production systems of: plum and damson, raspberry and blackberry, and blueberry should be required.
- Monitoring information on the usage of the product in relation to SWD trap counts.
- Information regarding the relative level of risk of attack by SWD based on the area of the crop affected in previous seasons. For example, how much of the protected crop and outdoor crop is grown in Scotland and the risk of infections so far North compared with the South East. Is the whole of the National crop at risk and why; based on suitable evidence.
- To support an emergency authorisation on protected cherry, information (data or justification) must be submitted to support the residues risk area.

The Emergency Authorisation is attached to this letter.
